



2021-2022 Scholarship Program for Undergraduate Students

Guidelines

Program Guidelines & Priorities:

- * Seeking undergraduate students with a record of leadership and volunteerism in the community in non-school sponsored activities and participation in extracurricular school activities.
- * Applicants must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited HBCU for the Fall 2021/Spring 2022 academic year (enrollment must begin in the Fall) with the intention of maintaining full-time status for the entire year. (HBCU is defined as "historically black colleges and universities".)
- * ***This application is not for graduating high school seniors.*** All incoming freshman must complete the application for the 2021-22 Scholarship Program for Graduating High School Seniors.
- * Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- * Applicant must be a United States Citizen
- * Applicants must be pursuing an undergraduate degree in the sciences with the intention of pursuing that discipline as a career. The following majors will be considered: Biomedical and Biological Sciences, Engineering and Engineering Technology, Health Professions, Mathematics and Statistics, Physical Sciences, Psychology, Science Technology.
- * Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation that are specific to your application to the Freemont Foundation Scholarship Program: professor, counselor, or administrator and one from a community member or officer of an organization in which the applicant is affiliated. ***Do not submit more than two letters.***
- * Applicants must submit the most recent official transcript. This transcript must contain the official school stamp or seal. It may be mailed or emailed. If it is emailed, it must be sent directly to the Freemont Foundation from the school/institution or from the school's official transcript service.
- * The letters of recommendation and transcript may either be included in the application package, sent separately, or emailed.
- * Applications and all supporting documents must be postmarked February 1, 2021 or received by email by February 1, 2021. Late applications and supporting documents will not be accepted.
- * Your name must be on all materials.
- * **THE APPLICATION MUST BE TYPED.**
- * **THE APPLICATION, ESSAY, AND RESUME MUST BE TYPED AND RETURNED BY MAIL.**
