



2022-2023 Scholarship Program for Graduating High School Seniors

Guidelines

Program Guidelines & Priorities:

- * Seeking graduating seniors attending high school in the United States with a record of leadership and volunteerism in the community in non-school sponsored activities and participation in extracurricular school activities.
- * Applicant must complete high school by the spring of 2022.
- * Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale, excluding home school studies) and plan to attend an accredited HBCU. (HBCU is defined as “historically black colleges and universities”.)
- * Applicant must apply to and be accepted into an accredited HBCU by July 1, 2022 and must plan to matriculate at accredited HBCU for the Fall 2022/Spring 2023 academic year (enrollment must begin in the Fall) with the intention of maintaining full-time status for the entire year.
- * Applicant must have minimum SAT score of 1150 or ACT score of 21.
- * Applicant must be a United States Citizen
- * Applicant must intend on pursuing an undergraduate degree in the sciences with the intention of pursuing that discipline as a career. The following majors will be considered: Biomedical and Biological Sciences, Computer Science, Engineering and Engineering Technology, Health Professions, Mathematics and Statistics, Physical Sciences, Psychology, Science Technology.
- * Applicant must submit two letters of recommendation that are specific to the application for the Freemont Foundation Scholarship Program:
 - one from a high school teacher, counselor, or principal;
 - one from a local community member or officer of an organization in which the applicant is affiliated.

Do not submit more than two letters. The letters of recommendation must be signed by the person writing the letter; digital or electronic signatures will not be accepted and will void your application. The letters may either be included with your application submission or emailed separately from the persons writing your recommendation.

- * The most recent official electronic transcript must be sent from your high school.
 - The official transcript(s) may be sent electronically via email from the school directly or from a transcript service such as Credentials Solutions, Parchment or other transcript service.
 - We will not accept transcripts sent via email from applicants.
 - If your official transcript cannot be sent electronically, a school official can email transcripts to scholarship@freemontfoundation.com. The email address must be associated with the sending institution. Transcripts sent from Hotmail, Gmail, Yahoo, or other generic email providers will not be accepted.
 - If your school is no longer in operation, you must confirm that your academic records can still be obtained. If your transcript is no longer available, contact us at info@freemontfoundation.com.
